


Vision for the Future

We champion the rich diversity of talent, backgrounds, beliefs and culture that are embodied in the communities we fund, and strive to create more equitable, communitycentric river conservation.






We build trust through creative and strategic collaboration centered around the wellbeing of the rivers and the communities we serve.

Strategic Priorities

Connecting communities to their rivers

- We believe that when rivers are cared for by the people who live near them, both the community and the river thrive. We believe that everyone—regardless of their age, gender, race, culture, socio-economic status, physical ability or background—should have access to rivers and opportunity to enjoy and learn about them.
- Communities are actively involved in the design, prioritization and success of conservation projects at their rivers.

Protecting rivers, lakes and streams

- We work to restore the dynamic ecological processes of our freshwater systems. We strive to reconnect rivers with their floodplains, restore habitat within and along rivers, and enhance water quality and availability, among other approaches.
- Functioning river systems provide ample clean drinking water, recharge ground water and provide lush habitat for wildlife.
- Project selection is supported by the best available science, and helps us repeat the success of previous projects.

Safeguarding our way of life

- It is collaboration among community members, farmers, ranchers, tribes and agencies that creates river projects that benefit multiple priorities. We understand that water connects us all, and advance forward thinking-solutions that acknowledge the needs of local traditions and culture, local food production, drinking water supplies, recreation and wildlife habitat.
- Rivers define our quality of life. They are a resource for the entire community today, and for generations to come.
